1992

Founding of Westhill Institute

On September 1st, 1992, Westhill Institute opened its doors as an international American university preparatory school, approved by SEP and UNAM. The school was founded by Dra. Pilar Talayero (RIP), Ing. José María Riobóo, and Dr. Antonio Talayero. In the beginning, Westhill was, and still has, a campus in the beautiful suburban community of Lomas de Chapultepec.

TAAPS Accreditation

1995

SACS Accreditation

1997

New Campus (Middle & High School)

Due to increased enrollment, on August 25th, 1997, Westhill Institute's Middle and High School facilities expanded to share accommodations with Westhill University in the Santa Fe section of Mexico City.

By receiving a PYP education at Westhill Institute, students are prepared for success not only academically but also in the global community, developing skills and attitudes that will serve them well throughout their lives.



An MYP education at Westhill Institute is superior to a traditional education because it provides students with a comprehensive and globally-minded approach to learning. Unlike traditional education, which often focuses on rote memorization and a narrow set of skills, MYP education prioritizes interdisciplinary connections, inquiry-based instruction, and student agency, all of which foster critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving abilities. Additionally, the program's emphasis on social and emotional skills, service learning, and formative feedback help students develop a sense of social responsibility and become active participants in their communities. With these unique advantages, an MYP education at Westhill Institute prepares students for success in an ever-changing, interconnected world.



An IB DP education at Westhill Institute offers numerous benefits over a traditional education at a non-IB school. Students can develop critical thinking and research skills, gain an international perspective, and see connections between subjects through interdisciplinary learning. In addition, the program emphasizes personal and social responsibility through Creativity, Activity, and Service experiences, and the integration of ethical and moral considerations. Students can also prepare for university-level work and earn international recognition and college credit through the completion of IB exams. Overall, an IB DP education at Westhill Institute provides a well-rounded education that prepares students for success in a rapidly changing and interconnected world.

PRESCHOOL & KINDERGARTEN

Westhill Institute's Cárpatos campus has a Preschool and Kindergarten program, that offers an English immersion program to students from ages 1 to 6. Our students benefit from a constructivist and conceptual curriculum that focuses on the well-being of the child and appropriate development of each individual student.

Expanding upon the solid groundwork laid by the Creative Curriculum (for Transition, PS1 and PS2), our Primary Years Program(PYP) (Pre Kinder, Kindergarten and 1st through 5th grade) offers a child-centered, holistic approach to early years education. Our stimulating program provides children with the necessary tools and confidence to successfully adapt to, and benefit from, the challenging learning activities and classwork of the elementary school program.

Lifelong learning begins in preschool. Our highly experienced and qualified teachers instill a love for learning in each child through a balance of play, teacher and child-initiated inquiries, and dynamic learning experiences within our nurturing school environment









ELEMENTARY

At Westhill Institute's Carpatos Elementary campus, we offer an English immersion program to students from 1st to 5th grades and is designed to build on students' prior knowledge and understanding. Structured inquiry helps to ignite a child's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning.

Our elementary curriculum incorporates the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (PYP). The PYP prepares students for the intellectual challenges of further education and their future careers, focusing on the development of the whole child as inquirer, both in the classroom and in the worldat-large. The PYP curriculum is centered on six areas of instruction: language arts, social studies, math, science, the arts, and physical education. Learning is transdisciplinary in nature with six units of inquiry as the focus for learning throughout each grade level. Each unit of inquiry guides students to develop an understanding of a central idea and this central idea then becomes the foundation of studies across all subjects. Our language arts program is designed to allow students to become confident, competent readers and writers of English, Spanish, and French. There is a strong focus on the use of integrated technology within each unit of inquiry.

Learning and intellectual development are continually assessed through the use of a variety of formative and summative assessment techniques that measure students' understanding of concepts, knowledge, skills, and attitudes.



SANTA FE CAMPUS



Preschool, Elementary, Middle & High School

PRESCHOOL & KINDERGARTEN

At the Santa Fe Campus, the Preschool and Kindergarten programs also offer an English immersion program to students from ages 1 to 6. 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MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL

At Westhill, the Middle School and High School programs are designed for students in grades 6 to 12. Learners develop a breadth and depth of knowledge and are encouraged to flourish academically, physically, emotionally, and ethically by implementing a broad and balanced educational curriculum. Through the International Baccalaureate Middle Years (MYP) and Diploma Programs(DP), students learn how to learn by developing critical thinking, reading, writing, and research skills. Learners are encouraged to act responsibly in a rapidly changing, globalized world.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Westhill's Middle School follows the IB Middle Years Program (MYP), a five-year program of study that places the student at the center of learning. Students are encouraged to draw connections between all subject areas with learning explicitly linked to the world around them. Multilingualism is developed in English, Spanish, and French. A variety of formal and informal assessments are used to inform teaching and learning. The Personal Project is the culminating activity of the MYP and is a requirement for the successful completion of grade 10. It is a student-centered, extended inquiry research project which allows students to demonstrate and solidify their interdisciplinary knowledge and skills.













HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

The High School follows the IB Diploma Program (DP) for learners in grades 11 - 12. The DP is an internally and externally assessed program respected by leading universities around the globe.

Research has shown that DP students are better prepared than their non-IB peers to cope with demanding workloads, effective time management, and meeting academic and professional expectations. Throughout the DP, students develop academic excellence through an in-depth understanding of subject knowledge and explore the nature of knowledge itself through the program's unique Theory of Knowledge course. Students choose a selection from each of the following subject groups: Language A (English and Spanish), Language B, Individuals and Societies, Experimental Sciences, Mathematics, and Visual Arts.















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
